

# Highlights of Cairn Energy in India

Cairn Energy made more than 40 significant oil discoveries both onshore and offshore India.

Together with JV partners, Cairn Energy contributed >30% India's domestic crude oil production.

1997

Transaction with Shell gives Cairn Energy a 10% interest in the Rajasthan block



1996

Cairn Energy acquires Command Petroleum, an Australian company, and an interest in Ravva in the Krishna Godvari basin offshore east India. Cairn Energy becomes operator

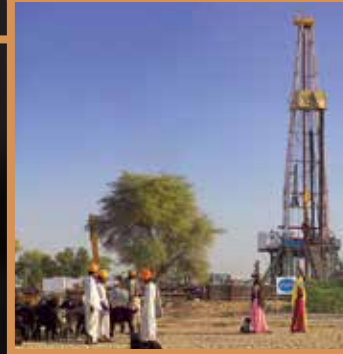
1998

Cairn Energy signs a Production Sharing Contract in the Cambay Basin offshore west India. Cairn Energy becomes operator

Ravva oil field reserves doubled

1999

First Rajasthan discovery (Guda field)



Ravva production increased from 3,700 barrels of oil per day to 50,000

2000

First discovery in Cambay Basin, Lakshmi field



2002

First gas produced from Lakshmi field. Discovery to delivery in 28 months

2001

Second discovery in Cambay Basin, Guari field

2003

Cairn Energy acquires 100% interest in the Rajasthan block from Shell

Across all operations, Cairn Energy aimed to make a positive impact working with local communities to improve infrastructure, health, education and trading prospects.

The Barmer district of Rajasthan now has an average income 40% higher than the national average and is the second largest contributor to Rajasthan's GDP.

Cairn Energy's discoveries have generated revenues of more than US\$20 billion for the state and national government.

## 2004

Major discovery of the Mangala field, followed by the Aishwariya and Bhagyam fields in the Rajasthan block



In 2004 Mangala was the largest onshore hydrocarbon discovery in India in 25 years

Bhagyam and Aishwariya were the second and third largest discoveries

## 2005

First oil from Cambay Basin, Gauri field

2000-2005 three out of seven landmark discoveries in India were made by Cairn Energy

## 2006

Initial Public Offering (IPO) of the India business

## 2007

Cairn India listed on the India stock market, National and Bombay Stock Exchanges

## 2009

First oil produced from Mangala field

Mangala Processing Terminal (MPT) was built and completed in 18 months

From discovery of Mangala field in 2004 to production of first oil in 2009, Cairn Energy successfully took the project from discovery to development in just five years

At peak construction ~16,000 workers involved – 11,000 on MPT and 5,000 on pipeline



Production commences via the pipeline from the Mangala field in Rajasthan



## 2010

Rajasthan development was one of the largest oil and gas projects in India in the heart of the Thar desert in the Barmer district in north west India. To carry Rajasthan crude to market Cairn Energy invested US\$1billion to build the world's longest heated pipelines

Mangala production reaches approved plateau production of 125,000 barrels of oil per day

## 2011

Gas discovery on the Mannar Basin offshore

40% shareholding in Cairn India sold to Vedanta Resources Plc
